It is all or nothing for Luz . . . until nothing stares her in the face.

It is a universal story of perseverance set within the unique context of South Texas.

. . . as well as 45 speaking roles and over 200 extras cast predominantly from South Texas. We tip our hat to the hard work of Casting Directors Toni Cobb Brock and Sally Allen of Brock/Allen Casting.

Where it started:

Amy Wendel and I wrote the script based on years of research, including interviews and workshops with residents and students of the South Texas towns of Benavides and San Diego. We ultimately returned to film the movie in these towns as well. It gave the film the authenticity the story deserved.

Where we are now:

After four weeks of filming in South Texas, we wrapped production on April 10 on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin (as one of very few films ever to receive permission to use the University's locations and logos).



Amy directed, and I produced along with veteran Austin-based producer Susan Kirr. Thanks to the fantastic work of our experienced crew and all the support we received locally, the shoot went extremely well

Over the Summer, we will be editing the footage, adding music, and mixing the sound in preparation for submitting to film festivals in the Fall in hopes of its premiering at a festival sometime in 2011.
